



Black Iron Grill's Covid Policies based on recommendations from BC Government

We adhere to the following

- A maximum of 6 people at a table
  - Two metres or physical barriers between tables
  - Customers must stay seated and cannot move between or visit other tables
  - No dancing
  - Normal liquor service hours
  - Masks are required when not seated at a table
1. Patrons must stay in the seat to which they are assigned and must not move from table to table or mingle with patrons from other parties when not seated. 8. No more than 6 patrons may be seated at a table, unless the party consists of one set of parents and their minor children.
  2. Liquor may only be served to a patron who is seated. Patrons must remain seated, other than to use washroom facilities, (e) to aid another person who requires care or first aid, (f) when leaving the premises
  3. For the purpose of doing any of the following with a maximum of five other persons who are in the same party as the patron and who are seated with the patron: There must be a distance of two metres between the backs of the seats of patrons seated at adjacent tables or booths, even if members of the same party are seated at adjacent tables or booths, unless the adjacent tables or booths are separated by physical barriers. 12. There must be two meters between patrons seated at a counter, unless the patrons are in the same party or they are separated by physical barriers.
  4. Hand washing facilities or alcohol-based sanitizers must be within easy reach of entrances, exits and washroom facilities;
  5. Valid QR code scan of double vaccination with proof of valid ID i.e. drivers license, passport, a certificate of Indian Status; a Métis Nation British Columbia citizenship and identification card; (e) a passport attesting to citizenship or other national status, issued by a government of any jurisdiction and including a photograph of the holder; (f) another form of identification, issued by a government of any jurisdiction, including a photograph of the holder; (g) a military identification card that is issued by a government of any jurisdiction, which includes a photograph of the holder; “proof of exemption” means (a) in the case of a person who is more than 18 years of age, photo identification and an exemption certificate; (b) in the case of a person who is 18 years of age or younger, an exemption certificate. “proof of vaccination” means (a) in the case of a person who is more than 18 years of age, photo identification and a vaccine card; (b) in the case of a person who is 18 years of age or younger, a vaccine card; “vaccinated” means to have received all doses of a vaccine or a combination of vaccines, intended for use in humans against SARS-CoV-2; “vaccine card” means proof in one of the following forms that the holder is vaccinated: (a) electronic proof or a printed copy of an electronic proof, (i) issued by the government in the form of a QR code, accessible through the Health Gateway online platform
